#### **Priory Catholic Primary School, Torquay**

Last week Classes 2 and 5 had a visit from Torquay Fire Station who came to give a talk on fire safety. Some of the children even had the opportunity to dress up.



#### Victorian Learning Programme at Powderham Castle

On Thursday, Classes 1 & 2 travelled by coach to Exeter to spend the day at Powderham Castle to take part in Powderham's 'Victorian Learning Programme'.



On arrival we were met by a costumed member of staff who gave a short welcome talk about what the day entailed.

In the Kitchen with Cook: Here we learnt about farming, seasons, deliveries, raw ingredients and menus. There was a cookery demonstration; griddle cakes were made for everyone, using Victorian kitchen implements and they were so delicious, Miss Whitehouse got the recipe! We were encouraged to think about the ingredients and compare kitchen utensils. We learnt about working conditions then and compared them to how it is now.



**Housekeeper's helpers:** We accompanied the Housekeeper on her daily inspection of the castle; carpet beating, sweeping and dusting along the way. The Housekeeper showed them her life in serving Lord of the Manor as she went about her rounds. She used some of the portraits to discuss clothes and highlight Victorian features in the different rooms and talked about them e.g. gas lighting. Next was boot polishing and floor cleaning in the Servants Hall!





During lunchtime the children had the opportunity to make their way through a Victorian toy box and were able to compare toys from the past. We were all worn out on the way home!
