Message from CEO

I am very pleased to be able to report that the visit on Tuesday of Christine Quinn our RSC, her colleagues from the South West RSC's office, and ESFA officers went well. They have accepted our Business Plan and our Recovery Plan but have commented that it will be very hard to meet the target dates that we have had to set, but we knew that already. I'm very grateful to Paul Cotter and Shelley England who hosted their visits to schools. It was clear, when they returned to St Boniface House that they had enjoyed them and plan to have a similar programme when they visit again. They were also pleased that Bishop Mark managed to meet them in between his visits to a homeless project in Bodmin and Channings Wood Prison; they clearly valued the opportunity to discuss our issues with him and hear directly his support for our future plans.

Having heard from OFSTED that Plymouth CAST would be mentioned in the Annual Report of Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills I was relieved to see that although she comments on the weaknesses identified in MATs that were not doing well, Plymouth CAST is only mentioned in the list of MATs that were reviewed during the year in question. Nevertheless her general comments about the MATs visited reflect the issues we are already addressing. I was also encouraged to read –

"We have learned over the past 10 years that increases in test scores do not necessarily reflect a real improvement in education standards. While tests are important and useful, they do not, and can never, reflect the entirety of what pupils need to learn. Exams should exist in the service of **the curriculum** rather than the other way round."

This is a lovely time of year for the children and I know how much hard work goes into the all the special activities you arrange for them, at the same time as having to manage the day to day life of the school. It is lovely to have so many positive contributions to this newsletter - please pass on my thanks to all your staff.

Special congratulations to the school choir from Sacred Heart Primary School in Paignton for their recent success winning BBC Radio Devon's 'Star for Christmas' singing competition. This is a fantastic achievement against very stiff competition, well done to all concerned.

I'm very grateful to all of you who contributed to the selection process earlier this week – I shall write again as soon as I can.
