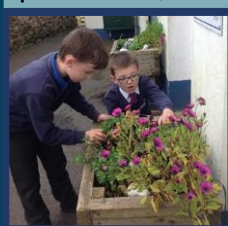
When children at St Mary's Axminster found out that one of their youngest pupils had spent much of this school year in hospital they decided to do something to make a difference.

St Joseph's Exmouth

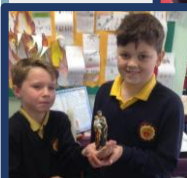
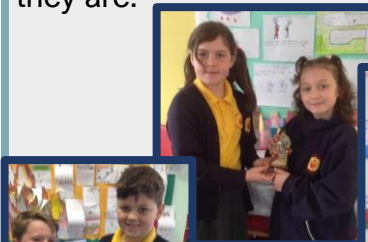
